Organization Working Strategy

Since its inception and in accordance with its vision and mission, the organization has been working with the most exploited and underprivileged sections of the community. The organization gathers information through different types of research and surveys in its area of work, in order to create awareness about issues faced by the community. It first creates awareness within the community on relevant issues and then works along with the community to formulate strategies to resolve these issues and these issues and their strategies are then shared with donor organizations.

The organization works to prepare leaders from within the community itself, around issues that the community is facing and works on the capacity building of these leaders, in order to formulate strategies to resolve these issues. In all its programmes, the organization works with the affected community, the local government and other stakeholders at different levels to resolve issues.

The organization attempts, in its field of work, to work on emerging issues, through regular engagement with the community, and also tries to emulate successful examples of problem solving in its area of work in new areas of work too. This helps a large section to benefit from the work experience of the organization.

Organizational strength

Based on its work experience in the past 20 years, the organization specialises on the 3 issues of child development, child labour, welfare of workers and promotion of livelihoods and the organization has models that it has developed to work on these issues. Besides, given that the organization has experience with the different kinds of challenges and has developed strategies to deal with them, it does not face any problems in the implementation of programmes.

In addition to this, the organization has forged its own identity in the community because of its effective community engagement and it is also working with other partner organizations on community engagement, child development and livelihood promotion and it also imparts training on access to social security schemes.

The organization works towards bringing gender equality in its programs and is working on women's rights and improving decision making among women. The organization always gives priority to women in its programs and is at present working to empower women through self-help groups, mothers' committees and women labour organizations

The organization works primarily with the most affected sections of the community such as victims of silicosis, workers who are accident victims, malnourished children and migrant workers. In addition, the organization prioritizes the inclusion of women and disabled people in all its programs.



Welfare & Rights of Unorganized Sector Labourers



We are working for the betterment of unorganized and migrant laborer in central Rajasthan from last 15 years. More than 90 percent of total workforce of India is working as a migrant and unorganized laborer these unorganized laborers are not getting safe workplace and also not aware about the rights and entitlement implementing form them.

We mainly focusing on some laborer issues like legal disputes, unavailability of occupational safety at working places, lack of linkages with social security schemes etc.



Major Objective

- Ensure the legal awareness to 50,000 migrant laborers for provide legal aid to victims of labour law violation.
- Ensure benefits of government health care service to minimum 5000 migrant laborer families and linkages of minimum 7000 laborers with social security schemes by operating counselling centers.
- Reduce the numbers of laborer accidents at the workplace and provide labour friendly environment for migrant and unorganized laborer families.
- To provide alternative livelihood options for laborer working in Hazardous industries.

Workplace safety Training



To reduce occupational accident and disease we are providing safety training for laborers for better understanding on workplace hazards and how they can protect themselves from this misshaping's in the last one year we organized 22 workplace safety training through these training we aware 1124 laborer on workplace hazards. Through the regular trainings of laborers on workplace related accidents and diseases the number of accidents reduced in last years.

Legal awareness and Legal Aid

Due to lack of knowledge about labour law's many of Unorganized and migrant laborers exploited every year. We are generating awareness among the workers and providing them platform for rise their voice against violation. In the last year through the village level meeting and legal awareness campaign we aware more than 28,000 laborer and after the awareness we registered 410 cases and in that 200 cases ware resolved and laborer got the amount of Rs. 29,68,516.

Health Camps for Migrant Labourers

Migrant laborer working in unorganized sector are not getting any health services from govt. systems and so many unqualified health practitioners are practicing in these work side areas due to these unsafe practitioner so many labors are facing health issues after treatment and the cost of treatment of these unqualified practitioner is also too high. We with the support of local health department organized health camps for migrant laborers in the last year we organized 24 health camps and more than 2,100 laborers got benefits from these camps.

Social Security Linkages Camps

Govt runs many schemes for migrant and unorganized laborer but due to lack of knowledge and proper follow-up system eligible persons facing problem in social security entitlement we are organizing camps for laborers to link them with different social security schemes in the last year we have organized 40 social security camps and through these camps 1464 laborers linked with social security schemes.



Impact Stories

Impact Story - 1

Timely Vaccination and Support During Delivery*

During the pregnancy, timely vaccinations were administered. The laborer's vaccinations and nutrition were monitored, and she underwent tests at a government hospital, which revealed iron deficiency. Her husband was informed about the risks associated with iron deficiency during



delivery. As the time approached, when labor pains began, she was taken to the nearby sub-health center. Due to the iron deficiency, the doctor referred her to a higher facility. Her husband informed the organization's staff via phone. In the meantime, Neelam Chauhan, an organization worker, arranged for Ful Kumari to be admitted to the district hospital in Byawar. Ful Kumari delivered another daughter,

but her health deteriorated due to the iron deficiency. The doctor advised arranging for a blood transfusion. Due to her financial situation, she was unable to arrange the blood. The organization worker requested the charitable trust to arrange for the blood by briefing the doctor on Ful Kumari's condition. After participating in a trustee meeting, the worker managed to arrange one bottle of blood. The blood transfusion led to an improvement in Ful Kumari's health. Upon discharge from the hospital, both the mother and baby were re-examined by the doctor and were found to be healthy. Ful Kumari now has a 5-month-old healthy daughter and has resumed her daily activities. Ful Kumari expressed her deep gratitude to the organization and its workers for protecting her during the risks of delivery.

Child Development and Child Rights



GSVS is committed to promoting child rights and development through projects at Anganwadi Centers and by raising awareness among school children about quality education, good health, and the rights provided by the Government of India. By developing effective ground-level strategies and accessible methods, we are achieving significant results in both urban and rural areas of Ajmer. Our primary focus is on improving the health status of malnourished children.

We achieve this through organizing multiple health camps, providing regular health follow-ups, supplying essential nutritional supplements, and conducting positive parenting sessions. We also educate pregnant and lactating mothers on the benefits of a nutritious diet, timely vaccinations, newborn care, and healthy living habits.

The Anganwadi is a key component of child development, where children receive education, health care, and nutrition. To strengthen the services provided by Anganwadi centers, efforts were made to increase community engagement at the centers. This involved capacity building of 190 members of Anganwadi Development Committees and enrolling 3,783 children aged 3 to 6 years for pre-school education. Regular assessments of pre-school education were conducted, and training programs for Anganwadi workers were organized to enhance the effectiveness of pre-school education. To ensure health and nutrition, 4,521 children aged 0 to 3 years were enrolled in Anganwadi services. For children aged 0 to 5 years, health assessment was conducted for 13,563 children between 6 months to 5 years, identifying 573 with moderate and severe malnutrition. These children were given medical consultation and treatment through community-based malnutrition management camps, and were provided with RUTF (Ready-to-Use Therapeutic Food) with regular follow-ups.



Training for 165 ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist) workers was also organized for the CMAM (Community-based Management of Acute Malnutrition) camps to ensure the activity was effectively implemented in the field. To ensure nutrition among pregnant, lactating mothers, and adolescents, 425 kitchen gardens were established, yielding 4,570 kilograms of vegetables.

To increase community involvement at Anganwadi centers, monthly meetings of 190 Parent Committees were organized, focusing on center engagement and support. The average attendance at these meetings was 2,300 per month. Quarterly meetings of the Anganwadi Development Committees, formed to ensure smooth and community-supported operations of the centers, were held at each center. This resulted in quality operations of Anganwadi centers and material support worth over 5.3 million rupees from various donors. Local community activities were organized by the Anganwadi Development Committees to enhance the reach of Anganwadi services to the people.

Through community involvement, the Anganwadi center at Paltan Bazaar, Ajmer city, received a building constructed by the Cantonment Board, Ajmer with support from the organization and the community. The center now provides high-quality services to the children.

Impact Story - 1

Saaransh

Saaransh, a 2-year-old with a heart condition, lives with his parents Jaykishan and Madhu, who are registered with the Trambe II Anganwadi Center. Saaranish's father suffers from a severe illness, and Madhu has been struggling with the costs of his treatment. After initially being covered by his grandfather, the high costs of private hospital care forced a halt in treatment. The Khushi Project worker recommended treatment at a government hospital. Despite Madhu's lack of identification documents causing delays, both her and Saaranish's documents were eventually obtained with the help of the organization. Saaranish was enrolled in the National Child Health Program and admitted to the Cardiology Department at Sawai Mansingh Hospital in Jaipur on October 5, 2022. He successfully underwent surgery on October 8, 2022.

Impact Story - 2

The success of community efforts

The Paltan Bazaar Anganwadi Center had been operating in a small rented room with an average enrollment of 15 children. Due to the room's limited space and thatched roof, the center faced challenges in conducting activities and managing rainy season waterlogging, which occasionally forced it to close.

The Khushi Project sought to address these issues by engaging with the local community and the Cantonment Council. Despite initial difficulties in finding a suitable room due to space and budget constraints, persistent efforts led to a successful meeting with the Cantonment Council officials. They agreed to provide a room at the Cantonment Board's Children's Park and ensure necessary utilities.

Following the officials' approval, the room was renovated and furnished. The Anganwadi Center is now operating effectively in a more suitable environment.

Livelihood Promotion

Project Goal: Pro poor and backward Families of 20 villages of Piprali block have sustainable income through Goat based livelihood and increased access to existing government schemes and services.

Project Objective:

- Additional household income of Rs. 16500 18,000 per annum per household by Y2 for 500 households and an additional income of Rs. 800010,000 per annum per household for another 1000 households from goat-rearing
- Promotion and strengthening of financially viable community based institutions (with SHGs as the base) for goat-rearing which deliver the services of veterinary health care, insurance, breed improvement and facilitate market linkages for members.
- 1000 families will be linked to government schemes as per eligibility affected due to the COVID 19.

Impact Story - 1



Babita Becomes a Goat Breeder Babita from Palasra village is setting an example of women's empowerment by becoming a goat breeder. Babita and her husband are agricultural laborers, living 30 kilometers away from the district headquarters of Sikar. They have two children who are studying. In February 2021, Babita started goat farming by joining a livelihood enhancement project based on goat breeding. Initially, Babita had only one goat, but by joining the goat breeding group, she learned about the management of kids (baby goats) and connected with the Saksham Sakhi Women Producer Company. She took a loan of ₹40,000 and began rearing five male kids. All these male kids have been fattened regularly, and Babita mentions that she expects to earn approximately ₹30,000 to ₹35,000 per kid by selling them during Eid. Currently, Babita has stopped working as a laborer and earns ₹2,000 to ₹3,000 every month from goat farming. She believes that by motivating other women laborers to take up goat farming, it can be turned into a profitable business through Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs).
